GREETINGS FROM CHAIRMAN, FAY MILLER

Animal lovers and trainers know that pets respond best to positive reinforcement. Our pets want to please us and quickly learn the behaviors or tricks we want them to learn when they are rewarded with treats and praise. It's also important to be consistent. When a pet exhibits a behavior we desire, we need to reinforce that response in a positive way. Conversely negative reinforcement, such as physical abuse and punishment, rarely works. A pet that is mistreated becomes mistrustful, confused, and withdrawn or aggressive. Both the pet and its owner are disappointed in the outcome.

We are always sad to see a pet surrendered to the shelter because of issues that can be corrected with proper training and reinforcement. There are several websites that offer good advice. Do pets need to have their dental health monitored just as we do? The answer is a resounding YES. We all notice when our pets start to have that stinky smell coming from their mouths. When they have halitosis, kissing them is not much fun. But, how many of us know what causes the malodor?

Halitosis is not caused by the tartar that we can see on our pets' teeth. It results when plaque gets mineralized on the enamel. When that happens, bacteria start colonizing on the gaps between layers of tartar and just wait for food particles to get trapped on the rough surfaces. Fermentation and partial digestion of proteins and fat combine to give our pets that stinky breath none of us like to encounter.

The volatile gases that form during this process damage the gum lining. That leads to inflammation and loss of gum edges. If left unchecked, it will cause gingivitis and sometimes (especially in cats) stomatitis that can damage tooth attachment with decay.

Our teeth are similar to logs that are used to grind food so tartar forms mostly between our teeth. Cat and dog teeth are more like mountain tops, and the tartar forms both on the sides and the tops of their teeth.

If left untreated tartar continues to build up on teeth. Eventually the very act of eating kibble will cause the tartar to crack and dislodge, and the animal will swallow bits of it along with the resident bacteria. Stomach acid may not be sufficient to kill all the bacteria, and it will pass into the intestinal tract where it can be absorbed into the blood. Even though there are

protective mechanisms that can chase bacteria and destroy it, some will survive and migrate to the kidneys where they can do serious and often permanent damage. If enough damage is done, the animal will progress to kidney failure. When kidney failure occurs, there is not much that can be done. Dialysis or a kidney transplant are the last resorts.

Public awareness and education are leading humans to better dental health. The same is true for our pets. Veterinary dentists report that the majority of pets show signs of periodontal disease at age three. That's why we must be proactive and be sure our pets are getting proper preventative measures. There is a new definition of dental care in veterinary medicine postulated nationally with the acronym COPAT (comprehensive oral prevention assessment and treatment).

It's very important to pay attention to our pets' dental needs as part of their overall health care. Be sure to ask your vet to assess their status on a regular basis. Their kidneys, eyes, and liver will thank you for COPAT.


